Council President Killeen stated his reasons for reconsideration of this ordinance and the need for qualified personnel in these particular positions that have safety implications. He stated that double-dipping in general is not a good policy, but in certain situations, it would make sense, especially if it is not at high-level positions. He also feels that the current restrictions in no way hinder the Mayor's ability to hire people.

ORDINANCE NO. 2015-157: AN ORDINANCE WAIVING THE COMPENSATION

REDUCTION PROVISION OF SECTION 167.26(B) AS TO

PERSONNEL IN THE FIRE DEPARTMENT, AND

DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Councilmember Appel moved, seconded by Councilmember Nunnari, that Ordinance No. 2015-157 be adopted. Discussion ensued as follows:

Councilmember Sullivan did not wish to reiterate his stand on the issue but pointed out that this ordinance covers not only two part-time fire inspectors, which positions have been unsuccessfully filled up to this point, but one part-time fire marshall as well, which hasn't been considered at all.

Councilmember O'Donnell stated the issue has been under consideration for two years and that this code section has indirectly deterred some qualified candidates for these positions. He is in favor of the ordinance and supports it because of the need due to the growth in the city.

Mayor Clough appreciated Council's reconsideration of this ordinance because of the benefit to the citizens in being able to hire qualified personnel.

Councilmember Nunnari was in favor of the ordinance and concurred with Councilmember O'Donnell's comments.
