



CITY OF WESTLAKE, OHIO ORDINANCE NO. 2015-60:

AN ORDINANCE SUPPLEMENTING SUBSECTION (a) OF SECTION 313.11 ENTITLED "RIGHT TURNS ON RED PROHIBITED," AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor, Chief of Police and Director of Engineering have recommended that subsection (a) of Section 313.11 entitled "RIGHT TURNS ON RED PROHIBITED" be supplemented to provide for no right turns on red at an additional location; and

WHEREAS, Council desires to supplement subsection (a) of Section 313.11 entitled "RIGHT TURNS ON RED PROHIBITED."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WESTLAKE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1: That subsection (a) of Section 313.11 entitled "RIGHT TURNS ON RED PROHIBITED" be and the same are hereby supplemented and as supplemented shall read as follows:

## "313.11 RIGHT TURNS ON RED PROHIBITED.

- (a) Drivers of motor vehicles are hereby prohibited from making a right turn against a red light at the following locations at all times:
  - (1) Route 2, I-90, Columbia Road northbound exit ramp.
  - (2) Crocker Road southbound at Center Ridge Road (except curb lane).
  - (3) Route 2, I-90, Crocker Road westbound exit ramp (except curb lane).
  - (4) Bradley Road southbound at Schwartz Road until the new signal is activated.
  - (5) Schwartz Road eastbound at Bradley Road until the new signal is activated.
  - (6) Route 2, I-90, Crocker Road eastbound exit ramp (except curb lane).

Section 2: That any Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to this legislation were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 10, Article XI of the Charter of the City of Westlake and Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4: That this legislation is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to protect pedestrians, prevent traffic collisions and to promote safe and orderly egress of traffic from the interstate, and further provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
