



CITY OF WESTLAKE, OHIO ORDINANCE NO. 2016-4:

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE BLOCK K PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE FUND (#428) WITHIN THE 2015 FINANCIAL RECORDS OF THE CITY OF WESTLAKE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, this Council deems it to be in the best interest of the City to create such a fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WESTLAKE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1: That this Council does hereby direct the Director of Finance to create a special revenue fund entitled the Block K Public Infrastructure Fund (#428) in the 2015 financial records of the City of Westlake.

Section 2: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to this legislation were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 10, Article XI of the Charter of the City of Westlake and Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: That this legislation is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to establish a fund for the placement of monies for Block K infrastructure improvements, and further provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
