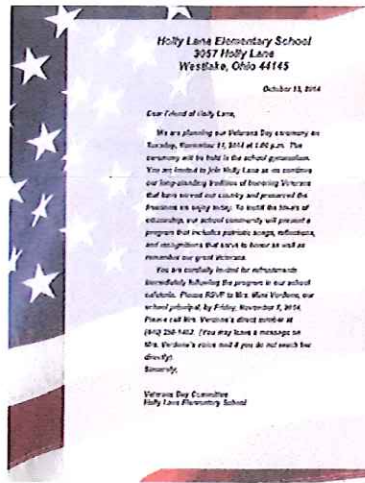

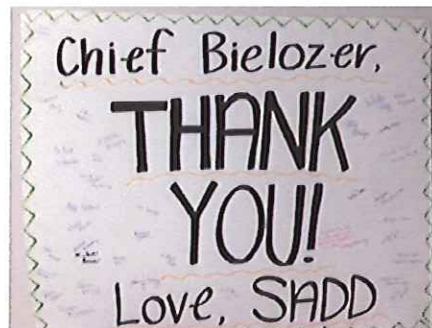

What Is A.L.I.C.E. Training?

A.L.I.C.E. Training is designed to enhance the current “lockdown” procedures used frequently in our educational institutions. These same concepts can also be used in businesses, shopping malls, and theaters. The concepts increase the survivability of those involved in an Active Shooter incident. The goal is to survive. The concepts provided allow for those in danger to think for themselves and make decisions on what is best for them, in their situations, and in the moment.

Acronym:

- A** **L** **E** **R** **T**: **Danger Announcement**
- L** **O** **C** **K** **D** **O** **W** **N**: **Semi-secure starting point from which to make safety decisions.**
- I** **N** **F** **O** **R** **M**: **Provide real time information to those in danger**
- C** **O** **U** **N** **T** **E** **R**: **Use simple proactive techniques to counter aggressive actions if necessary**
- E** **V** **A** **C** **U** **A** **T** **I** **O** **N**: **Remove as many from the danger zone as quickly as possible**

2014 Detective Bureau

Some of the more interesting cases this year

January

An investigation began into a drug dealer who lives at a trailer park on Center Ridge Road. Further checking revealed the suspect was committing weapon and sex offenses. Subsequently, an undercover officer purchased 300 packages of "spice" from the suspect. Agents from WEB (The WestShore Enforcement Bureau) assisted us with the buy/bust and search warrants. The suspect was convicted and sent to prison, three vehicles were forfeited. The sex offense is still under investigation.

Detective Bureau members responded to the jail when a prisoner was found unresponsive and later passed away. Investigators from the State of Ohio and the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's Office were called in to investigate. We worked with the investigators and maintained the scene, gathering all evidence to include police reports, video surveillance and jail logs.

Detectives investigated an arson case. The Westlake Fire Department was called in to extinguish a house fire and felt the circumstances were suspicious. It was later determined, a young mentally challenged female who was living with the homeowner started the fire. Prosecutors declined to charge the suspect due to her mental status.

February

A law enforcement officer from a neighboring agency reported receiving threats from three suspects he arrested. All of the suspects were illegal immigrants. We learned friends of the arrested persons were working at a hotel in Westlake. Detectives investigated and found individuals on scene without proper U.S. documents. U.S. Border Patrol responded and arrested all but one person detained by Westlake.

March

Detective Bureau personnel responded to Clague Park to investigate after a female was located who claimed she was possibly drugged and abducted. The female has a history of blackouts and could not provide many details. Subsequently, we turned everything over to Lakewood Police.

Detectives responded to a residence after a 12 year old girl called to report her father and his friend were drinking and smoking marijuana in the basement of a residence. Responding officers saw drugs and paraphernalia in plain view. The males were arrested and subsequent search warrants were executed. The males had enough drugs to warrant trafficking charges.

Westlake Detectives responded to a house fire set by the son of the homeowner. The suspect assaulted his parents and swung a gold club at his father's head. The suspect fought with officers who used a Taser on him. The fire caused substantial damage to the residence. The suspect is believed to have mental issues and is in a secure lock down facility at this time.

Detective Bureau personnel investigated a New York resident who used a counterfeit credit card at the Crocker Park Apple Store. The suspect had a large quantity of fake cards in his possession. Unsuspecting victims of identity theft had their information stolen to create the fake cards.

April

Detectives were called to assist at the scene of a "drive by" shooting at a Center Ridge Road business. A gunshot was fired into a building while a Patrol Officer was inside. The scene was processed with the help of federal crime scene specialists and a laser. We were able to track the trajectory of the bullet and determined the round came from a passing motorist. Video surveillance footage in the area helped us locate the suspect vehicle. Two days later, investigators served a search warrant and arrested the person responsible. A full confession was obtained.

Detectives investigated a sex offense involving an adult male and two of his male juvenile relatives. A search warrant was obtained for the suspect's residence. Investigators interviewed the suspect and obtained a full confession. The Cuyahoga County Grand Jury indicted the suspect on twenty six felonies. Later the judge sentenced the suspect to life in prison without the possibility of parole.

May

Detectives responded to a residential burglary in the western portion of the city. The suspect stole several firearms and expensive jewelry. One of the suspects used a resident's cellular telephone to call for his "ride". The cellular telephone carrier was convinced to conduct an emergency trace of the number called. Investigators tracked the suspect(s) in real time and made two arrests. Several stolen items were recovered and we learned where the stolen merchandise was sold. A warrant was obtained for the third suspect. Search warrants were served on a resale shop and a residence in Cleveland. Subsequently, everyone involved was convicted and sentenced to prison.

June

Detectives responded to a report of a suspicious male trying to gain entry to a local elementary school. Later, we determined his identity and interviewed him and his mother. The Westlake High School SRO (Student Resource Officer) knows the suspect who admits to reading books on school shootings. He said he was just trying to get inside the school and talk to his old teachers.

We shared information with a Brooklyn Heights detective who was building a case on a career criminal we dealt with a couple years ago. The suspect is known to steal tools and trailers. We sent him to prison in 2011. Apparently he was out now and reoffending.

July

Detectives worked undercover at Crocker Park for a gathering billed as a “flash mob” by organizers. Protesters were upset with the United States backing Palestine in the Middle East. No incidents of violence occurred.

Investigators assisted in the felonious assault case where one brother stabbed another and put him in the hospital. The suspect was later arrested, but claimed self-defense.

The investigation began into a father accused of sexually assaulting his daughters and their friends over a period of several years. A search warrant was served and the suspect fled out of state. Agents for the United States Marshal Service later located the suspect out west and returned him to face charges in Ohio.

August

Detective Bureau personnel responded in the early morning hours to assist in an attempted murder case. Agents from the State of Ohio helped us process the scene. The suspect stabbed both of his parents; and the father was critically injured. An arrest was made that night; the suspect reportedly has mental issues. Both victims have since recovered; the suspect is in a secure facility awaiting competency.

A truck and trailer were stolen from a local business. The crime was recognized as similar to a “career criminal” whom we have arrested in the past. The same individual Brooklyn Heights called us about earlier in the year. Later, we recovered the truck, trailer, and some of the tools. Eventually, we arrested this person and his accomplice and both confessed. The victim was quite impressed that we closed the case the same day and offered many thanks.

September

A female victim of felony domestic violence changed her story at the Cuyahoga County Grand Jury. We had to re-arrest the suspect to charge him with a misdemeanor locally. The suspect is reportedly a violent Aryan Nation gang member. Investigators coordinated his surrender at the station.

The Detective Bureau responded to the scene of a suspicious sudden death. The victim was a "loner" at his Detroit Road condo. The case is possible drug related but we are waiting for toxicology tests. We are working with the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's Office Investigator on the case.

October

An ongoing investigation into multiple thefts from residents at a Detroit Road assisted living facility produced enough evidence for an arrest. The suspect is the administrator of the facility. We believe she stole medication from unsuspecting residents. The case is pending in court and the suspect's bond condition prohibits her from visiting the facility or contacting any of the employees or residents.

Detective Bureau members responded to the Dover Gardens Tavern crash to handle the evidence. Investigators subpoenaed the medical records for all the victims. Later we worked with prosecutors from Lorain and Cuyahoga County on filing the appropriate charges.

One of our Auxiliary Police Officers asked us to assist with locating a stolen truck in a case of suspected insurance fraud. Investigators ran a license plate check on the truck and learned it was parked in an apartment complex in Euclid about one week prior. The insurance company was prepared to pay the "victim" \$12,000 for the vehicle before we found it. The truck was found undamaged.

November

A former bookkeeper was indicted on embezzlement charges after failing to pay taxes and pocketing the money. Two businesses were involved; one located in Westlake and one located in Avon Lake. Westlake detectives assisted on the arrest while Avon Lake detectives brought the charges together in one case

December

Law Director John Wheeler reported a suspect portraying himself as "an attorney for the City". The suspect made a telephone call to a business and a recording of the call was provided to us. The crime is a first degree misdemeanor. We called him back pretending to be a worker with the company and the suspect continued with the lie.

While investigating a theft suspect for stealing UPS packages off of porches, it was learned that the suspect had guns and additional stolen merchandise. Detectives searched several residences in Cleveland to recover evidence.

The Westlake Police Department jail was opened in 1991. It has three separate cellblocks, with a total of 13 cells. There are also cells for juvenile, intoxicated and suicidal prisoners. Male prisoners are always housed separately from female prisoners. Juvenile prisoners are not detained for very long in any case, and always separated from adult prisoners. Meals are provided by St. John Westshore Medical Center where they are carefully scrutinized by a dietician to ensure that the prisoners are eating a well-balanced diet.

Westlake Police Department - 2014 Warrant/Capias Statistics

An entered warrant is a warrant that is obtained from the Court after a person is charged with a crime but was not physically arrested at the time of the incident. A Capias is issued by the court when a subject does not show up for court or pay their fines/court costs. When the original warrant is received from the Court it is entered into:

- REDSS (Regional Enterprise Data Sharing System)
- LEADS (Law Enforcement Automated Data System)
- NCIC (National Crime Information Center)

This is done so that if a department or an officer runs the wanted subject through the system, they will be informed of the warrant, the agency that entered the warrant and the warrant information.

A "HIT" occurs when a department or an officer runs a subject through the computer systems and learns that he or she is wanted by another department. A department may detain the wanted person until the entering agency confirms their warrant and makes arrangements to pick up the wanted person.

"NO HIT" is when the court system recalls the warrant before it is served because the wanted person has fulfilled their obligation to appear or pay their fines and costs.
